



WALK DOWN TO THE LAKE SHORE & BROCKHOLE

DISTANCE: 1.2 Miles there & back

TIME: 1 hour

REFRESHMENTS: Brockhole Café (10.00 – 4.00 pm)

Overview of the walk

Just a short stroll over the road down to the Lake shore and a wander back through Brockhole (free entry to the grounds). Worth walking past the ferry jetty where there is a spectacular view over the Lake towards the Langdales, especially on a sunny evening. There are also Picnic tables here.

Directions

From the cottage walk down to the main road and cross via the traffic island.

Walk down the Entrance drive to Cragwood House Where the drive bears right there is a gate and a public footpath which leads straight down to the lakeshore.

To walk to the viewpoint walk behind the end of the zipline past the ferry point to the picnic area.

You can retrace your steps or wander back through the grounds of Brockhole when its open .

Warning: In summer 2016 there were reports of Blue green algae in Lake



Windermere this can be toxic to children and pets. The algae can usually be seen when it's concentrated in clumps which look like green flakes, greenish bundles or brownish dots. Environment Agency advice is to always keep children and pets away from the algae.
